About Barnabas Aid

Barnabas Aid is an international aid agency that supports Christian communities, churches and individuals around the world who face persecution and discrimination because of their faith.



1. We channel money, dry foodstuffs, medical and other aid **from** Christians **through** Christians **to** Christians. Donations from individuals and churches are forwarded to local ministries and Christian organisations in contexts of poverty, pressure and persecution to bring about practical and spiritual transformation in the lives of suffering believers.



2. We encourage prayer for the persecuted Church by providing comprehensive prayer materials. We believe in the power of prayer to change people's lives and circumstances, either through grace to endure or through deliverance from suffering.



3. We believe the clear Biblical teaching that Christians should treat all people (of all religions and none) with love and compassion – even those who seek to persecute them. We carry out our vision and purpose accordingly, but we will not compromise what we believe the Word of God teaches.

food.gives

“The generous will themselves be blessed, for they share their food with the poor.” – Proverbs 22:9

“We are so grateful to God for providing us with food through the generosity of Barnabas. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts!”

These are the words of Grace, whose family of seven was among the 1,008 Fijian families who received lentils, chickpeas, flour and rice in 2024 through food.gives.

In 2024 the food.gives project has delivered more than 5.2 million servings of food to our hungry brothers and sisters around the world.

food.gives functions as an international food bank, shipping food donated by Christians, through Christians, to Christians.

Our project partner in Zimbabwe described food.gives aid as “nothing short of life-saving”.

Zimbabwe declared a state of disaster on 3 April 2024 owing

to worsening drought, which has caused severe levels of food insecurity. Our supporters donated 23.5 tonnes of lentils that provided 470,000 servings to more than 11,600 people.

In 2024 food.gives also continued to send regular shipments of food, medical aid, clothes and more to our brothers and sisters in Ukraine.

The importance of our continued assistance was highlighted with our most recent aid shipment. “We are now left only with Barnabas’ help,” said our project partner, “and we are so thankful because you stay close to us.”

According to the World Food Programme, as many as 309 million people are currently facing chronic hunger, in 71 different countries. Many of these are our brothers and sisters. Please consider donating food, money or time so that the vital work of food.gives can continue.

Medical needs

A Christian in Lebanon receives Barnabas-funded medication



“LORD my God, I called to you for help, and you healed me.”

– Psalm 30:2

Many Christians live in uncertain or perilous circumstances, lacking access to medical resources and medicines so readily available in the West. Barnabas helps to meet their needs by funding medical facilities, equipment and medicines.

In recent years we have supported projects for Christians in places such as India, Pakistan, Nigeria, South Sudan, Haiti and countries in Central Asia.

The economic crisis in Lebanon has caused the price of medicines to rise so high that many impoverished Christians are rationing what little medication they have to make it last longer. Barnabas has been helping the chronically ill by providing the medication they need each month.

“Your support makes a big difference not only by providing medication but by giving people the assurance that they are not forgotten,” said our project partner.

Water

Christian communities in West African countries are among those who have been blessed by the provision of clean water, funded by Barnabas

“He split the rocks in the wilderness and gave them water as abundant as the seas; he brought streams out of a rocky crag and made water flow down like rivers.” – Psalm 78:15-16

Water is essential for life and health, yet many Christians have limited or no access to a supply of clean water for drinking, cooking and washing.

Christians are sometimes denied access to water because of their faith. Converts who have left the majority religion of their village or region are at particular risk.

As well as this, Christian women and girls often have to walk long distances to fetch supplies,

making them vulnerable to harassment or attack.

Believers are also among those who suffer the loss of clean drinking water after natural disasters such as floods and earthquakes.

In recent years Barnabas Aid has funded water projects in countries such as Bangladesh, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Chad, Pakistan and Sri Lanka. We also send bottled water or water-purifying tablets for areas afflicted by natural disasters.

Victims of violence

“No longer will violence be heard in your land, nor ruin or destruction within your borders, but you will call your walls Salvation and your gates Praise.”

– Isaiah 60:18

In many countries our brothers and sisters face persistent anti-Christian violence. Barnabas responds by reaching those affected by this violence and supplying vital aid.

There is no sign of an end to the violence towards Christians in northern and Middle Belt Nigeria. Thousands have been killed. Families are forced to flee from attacks, often taking only what they can carry.

Through our project partners we have provided these communities with food and other essentials – sleeping mats, blankets and mosquito nets, household items to replace those lost or destroyed when their homes were burned down.

Through training sessions and the provision of medical backpacks, volunteer first responders can provide life-saving care for the injured.

We supply educational resources for displaced children who have lost their teachers in the violence or been forced to flee far from their schools.

In the Christian area of Jaranwala, Pakistan, at least 24 churches and several dozen smaller chapels were set on fire, and the homes of more than 100 believers were burned, looted or vandalised by an Islamist mob in 2023. We delivered food and practical aid to around 1,000 individuals worst affected by the devastation.

A campaign of bombing and artillery attacks by the military against Christian-majority areas in parts of Myanmar has led to thousands being forced from their homes and land. Our partners in Myanmar have crossed unforgiving terrain to reach the displaced with essential supplies, including sleeping mats and blankets, medicine and food parcels.

Pastors and evangelists

A Barnabas-supported pastor baptises a believer in a remote mountain village in Vietnam



“Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers.” – Ephesians 4:11

The gifts and prayers of Barnabas donors support pastors and evangelists in their mission to grow God’s Church in places of persecution and oppression around the world.

Suffering Christians are strengthened in their love and faith for Jesus, and new converts are taught and discipled in the ways of the Lord.

Barnabas supports 40 church planters on Java, Indonesia’s most populous island. Extremists

among the Muslim-majority population, as well as followers of traditional religious practices, often stir up hostility towards marginalised Christian converts and pastors.

In Vietnam Barnabas supports a Bibles team of six who visit persecuted ethnic Hmong Christians in around 60 isolated mountain villages. The team, which is headed by a pastor, helps believers to stand firm in their faith with Bible teaching and prayer, and disciples church leaders.

Bibles and scriptures

"I am the happiest woman in the world," declares "Mima", on receiving her Bible after a wait of 49 years



"All your words are true; all your righteous laws are eternal."
– Psalm 119:160

"After 49 years of praying, God has amazingly answered my prayers. Praise the Lord!" exclaimed "Mima", a 64-year-old Karen Christian living in a remote village in Myanmar on receiving the precious gift of a Bible for the very first time.

"Reading the words of God is my favourite thing in life," she added.

Thanks to supporters' generosity, Barnabas has funded the transportation of 94,000 Bibles to Christians in Myanmar, who continue to endure violent

persecution from the country's military. Many recipients had prayed for decades for their own copy of the Bible.

Barnabas has also funded 100 Bibles in Kiswahili for a church on the Tanzanian archipelago of Zanzibar.

These will bless churchgoers and help train new pastors in a region where Christians are a tiny and persecuted minority, and few believers or even church leaders have a Bible to call their own.

Converts

Barnabas supports Ugandan ministries that provide converts with shelter, discipleship training, trauma counselling and vocational training, including this soap-making initiative



“Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: the old has gone, the new is here!” – 2 Corinthians 5:17

Converts to Christianity from other religions are often rejected by their families, former friends and communities. They may face ongoing hostility and even violence.

“Marat”, a Kyrgyz Christian convert from Islam, was told by his then best friend, “If I had a gun, I would be the first to shoot you because you believe in Jesus Christ.”

Barnabas provided food parcels for 150 impoverished convert

families (about 700 individuals) including Marat and his family living in a remote mountainous region of Kyrgyzstan. The parcels sustained them for three months.

Barnabas has funded vocational training in soap-making for 20 converts in Uganda. Whilst Uganda is 80% Christian, converts are often dismissed from Muslim-owned businesses. The training enables the new believers to get jobs in a church-owned soap-making facility.

Poverty relief

“Whoever is kind to the poor lends to the LORD.” – Proverbs 19:17

Many Christians live in poverty, often as a result of discrimination and marginalisation because of their love for Christ.

Large numbers of Iraqi Christians remain displaced in Iraqi Kurdistan, to which they fled in 2014 to escape Islamic State (IS, ISIS, ISIL, Daesh). Many of them are impoverished, having left behind all they owned in their historic homelands.

“Sometimes we have to borrow money to cover our rent and food. This month we won’t

need to,” said one believer after Barnabas provided food parcels for more than 2,000 poor Iraqi Christian families.

In Pakistan, Barnabas has freed 2,023 Christian brick kiln families from the yoke of bonded labour. During times of family crisis (for example, a medical emergency) underpaid brick kiln labourers are forced to borrow from their employers, which leaves them trapped in debt. Your donations have paid their debts and given them hope of a better future.

Disaster relief

“The righteous cry out, and the LORD hears them; he delivers them from all their troubles.” – Psalm 34:17

“When the relief material from our Christian brothers and sisters arrived, it was like a miracle.”

These are the words of Samana, a young mother in Nepal whose home was destroyed in a 5.6 magnitude earthquake, which left thousands homeless. More than 150 were killed.

Barnabas-funded food parcels containing rice, pulses and cooking oil, were distributed to 680 Christian families afflicted by the disaster. We also provided blankets to 380 households and warm clothes for 177 children.

In May 2024 record floods in Brazil killed more than 170 people and displaced half a million. Many of these were our Christian brothers and sisters.

Barnabas provided aid including food, cleaning

kits, clothes, furniture and household appliances. These provided relief in the immediate aftermath of the flooding, and helped our Christian family rebuild.

Mudslides caused by flash flooding in Kenya claimed many lives, as well as destroying homes and crops. Our Kenyan brothers and sisters, who have struggled with food insecurity for many years, were left without both food and shelter.

We provided emergency assistance of maize flour, cooking oil, beans and soap to 1,000 households in impoverished areas of the country.

Small businesses

“You will eat the fruit of your labour; blessings and prosperity will be yours.” – Psalm 128:2

Christians often struggle to find work in countries where they are a despised and persecuted minority. Any jobs they get are largely low income, low status tasks. Barnabas invests in hope by funding start-up costs for a range of small businesses that enable believers to become financially self-sufficient.

“This project has strengthened my faith in God’s plan for me. I have felt His presence in every step,” said “Dina”, an impoverished Christian widow in Egypt, who struggled to support her family following the death of her husband.

Barnabas helped Dina to set up a small grocery shop, enabling her to earn a living and meet the needs of her family. “It’s not just about selling groceries,” she added. “It’s about witnessing His grace in action.”

Dina is among hundreds of marginalised Egyptian Christian women (mostly widows) and

young men whom Barnabas has helped to escape poverty by providing funding for them to start small businesses including sewing or upholstery enterprises, digital printing ventures and in transport services.

In South-East Asia Barnabas helps to fund a number of income-generating initiatives in Laos and Vietnam where the minority Christian populations face hostility and harassment, particularly in rural areas.

We help impoverished believers start small mushroom, fish or pig farming ventures that provide families with an income and food security.

Training in sewing, hair and beauty, motorcycle maintenance or computer skills opens new opportunities for young people in these countries. This encourages them to remain in their villages rather than move away to seek work, thereby strengthening their church fellowships.

Christian schools for Christian children

“All your children will be taught by the LORD, and great will be their peace.”

– Isaiah 54:13

“I love my teachers so much and, when I come to school, I feel I am coming to my second home.” These are the words of Musa, a pupil in a Barnabas-funded Christian school for Sudanese Christian refugees in Egypt.

The parents of the school’s 369 pupils fled persecution and conflict in Sudan. They cannot afford to pay ordinary school fees for their children and are grateful that, thanks to Barnabas Aid, their children have the opportunity to learn to read and write.

As well as providing a nurturing Christian environment for the children to learn in, the school also provides jobs for adult Sudanese Christian refugees: it employs 27 teachers and seven other school staff. This allows refugees to earn a living and pay their bills as they set up their new lives in Egypt.

In Christian-minority contexts, Christian pupils may endure persecution and discrimination for their faith from other students and staff. In some cases they are even pressured to convert to the majority religion.

Barnabas-funded schools enable young believers from needy and vulnerable families to learn in a caring Christian environment. This not only strengthens them in their faith, but also empowers them to escape the cycle of poverty and destitution by gaining valuable skills and qualifications.

“I am thankful to God,” says 11-year-old Horab, a pupil at a Barnabas-funded school in Pakistan who hopes to become a doctor. “I am happy it is a Christian school where I can get a proper Christian education.”

Opportunity Africa

Helping our suffering Christian family in Africa

"Nobody ever asked me what I can do ... except Barnabas Aid." These words from Dalyop, a young Nigerian, demonstrate the importance of Barnabas Aid's new Opportunity Africa initiative.

Dalyop lost both his parents to anti-Christian violence at a young age. "I had lost hope and didn't know what to make of my life," he said. "I have been jobless for years." Now Dalyop is one of thousands in Nigeria studying digital content creation, a course that is funded by Barnabas.

The Church in Africa is growing. At the same time the challenges that face African Christians are also growing – including poverty, violence and terrorism, displacement, extreme weather and natural disasters.

With God's help and yours, Barnabas Aid is partnering with African Christian communities

to help them become more resilient, self-sufficient and independent. We are calling this Opportunity Africa. The aim of Opportunity Africa is to transform these communities in Africa through sustainability and human capacity development.

"We know that African Christians have the capacity, skills, determination, and resilience to turn their tragedies into opportunities and lamentations into praises," says Barnabas Aid's Africa Coordinator.

As well as vocational training, we are giving practical support to farmers, providing medical backpacks and training volunteers in how to use them, purchasing sewing and corn-grinding machines, funding schools for displaced Christian children, building homes – and this, God willing, is only the beginning.
